<u>AA HISTORY IN IOWA</u>

This month marks the anniversary of when AA first came to Cedar Rapids, March 20, 1944, to be exact. The entire story of how AA came to be in our area was highlighted in the June & July 2023 newsletters, which can be found on the district's website here.

How did Iowa Districts Come About?

As the service structure of AA grew in the 1960s, Lawrence V (Van) became very involved in our "Third Legacy". Van was so dedicated that he wanted to increase service work in the state. To do that, he attended AA conferences in Nebraska and found out how they developed their districts and brought the formula to Iowa. He also mapped out IO equal districts to help organize service. We now have 23 districts, and though it was originally in District 9, today Cedar Rapids is in District 8.

Van chaired the first state AA business meeting and at one meeting had to come down from the podium to break up a fight between two dedicated members who each thought they were right. Van went on to serve as the first delegate from **District 8.**

AA GRAPEVINE, the international journal of Alcoholics Anonymous, will increase the price of its print magazine for the first time in over 12 years. The new price for a yearly subscription is \$36.00, effective April 15, 2024. Complete announcement <u>here</u>.

We're really excited about our new Grapevine and La Viña apps (we've had over 26,000 downloads so far). Look for "AA Grapevine" or "AA La Vina" in your app store, then subscribe to access all of the magazine's content (in text and audio), the podcast, and our vast archives. The app subscription is only \$2.99 a month! Other features include a sobriety calculator and a daily practices checklist that you modify yourself. New features are coming, so keep on the lookout. You might want to ask your sponsees and AA network to download and subscribe. I've attached postcards with QR codes for your convenience.

Our popular weekly podcast

(https://www.aagrapevine.org/podcast) continues to attract listeners across the Fellowship and beyond, having just reached three-quarters of a million downloads. Tune in and share about it! Some groups even use podcast episodes as the basis for their meetings.
