## HENRIETTA SEIBERLING

Spiritual Catalyst in AA's Beginnings

#### BACKGROUND

- Born in 1888, daughter-in-law of Frank Seiberling, founder of Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company
- A deeply spiritual woman, active in the Oxford Group in Akron, Ohio
- Not an alcoholic herself, but dedicated to helping those who suffered

#### CONTRIBUTIONS TO AA

- Historic Meeting: On May 12, 1935 Henrietta welcomed Bill Wilson and Dr. Bob Smith into her home, the Gate Lodge at Stan Hywet Hall. This meeting set the stage for the fellowship that would become Alcoholics Anonymus
- Spiritual Encouragement: Offered prayer, hospitality, and a safe environment where recovery conversations could begin
- Oxford Group Influence: Introduced spiritual principles of honesty, confession, and reliance on God that

Though not an AA member, her actions provided the spark that gave rise to Alcoholics Anonymous

## **MARTY MANN**

AA PIONEER - ADVOCATE & EDUC

Among the first women in AA with long-term sobriety

Sponsored by Bill W. in the early years of AA

Became a leading voice for women in recovery

Founded the National Council on Alcoholism (NCA) in 1944

Worked to end the stigma surrounding alcoholism as a disease

Tireless advocate for education, treatment and acceptance




